Member reprimanded

On 29 May 2024, the Consent Orders Chair of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a member, Mrs Jean Elizabeth Ann Calas-Hathaway, of Surrey, United Kingdom:

Allegations

- 1. On or about the 24 November 2022 submitted, or caused to be submitted, an AML Declaration Form wrongly confirmed that steps had been taken to regularise compliance with The Money Laundering, Terrorist Financing and Transfer of Funds (Information on the Payer) Regulations 2017 ('MLRs 2017').
- 2. Between the 26 June 2017 and 12 May 2023 failed on behalf of her firm to demonstrate compliance with the requirements of the MLRs 2017, namely:
 - Regulation 18 (Risk assessment by relevant person); and / or a.
 - b. Regulation 19 (Policies, controls and procedures).
- By reason of her conduct, Mrs Calas-Hathaway is: 3.
 - Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i) in respect of the matters set out above. a.

The Consent Orders Chair ordered that Mrs Calas-Hathaway be reprimanded and pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £2000.00 and a fine of £3000.00.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
