Disciplinary Committee ordered student be severely reprimanded*

On 15 November 2024, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Abdul Latif of Islamabad, Pakistan:

<u>Allegations</u>

Mr Abdul Latif, a student member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants ('ACCA'):

- Contrary to Regulation 3(1) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2020, failed to co-operate 1) with the investigation of a complaint, in that he did not respond to any or all of ACCA's correspondence dated:
 - (a) 11 May 2021;
 - (b) 03 June 2021;
 - 21 June 2021. (c)
- 2) On 12 February 2021 during an on-demand FBT Business and Technology examination (the 'Exam'):
 - Caused or allowed a person to be in the testing space where he was taking the Exam, contrary (a) to Examination Regulation 1 and the Examination Guidelines.
 - (b) Failed to respond adequately to a proctor's instruction to keep his eyes on the screen, contrary to Examination Regulation 2.
- By reason of his conduct, Mr Latif is: 3)
 - (a) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i), in respect of any or all of the matters set out at Allegations 1 and 2 above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Abdul Latif be severely reprimanded and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £3,000.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
