## **Disciplinary Committee ordered student removed\***

On 03 October 2024, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Mohammed Suboor Khan of Nizamabad, India:

## <u>Allegations</u>

Mr Mohammed Suboor Khan, an ACCA student, on 03 December 2021, in respect of a remotely invigilated Financial Accounting exam (the exam):

- 1. Was communicating with another person and/ or people other than the exam proctor, contrary to Exam Regulation 16.
- 2. Permitted someone else to be in the room in which he was sitting the exam, contrary to Exam Regulation 20.
- 3. Contrary to Regulation 3(1) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014 (as amended), Mr Khan failed to co-operate with the investigation of a complaint, in that he did not respond to any or all of ACCA's correspondence dated:
  - 25 August 2022 a.
  - b. 16 September 2022
  - 16 November 2022 C.
  - 24 February 2023 d.
- 4. By reason of his conduct, Mr Khan is:
  - Guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i), in respect of Allegations 2 and 3 above and, a.

b. Liable to disciplinary action pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(iii) in respect of Allegation 1 above

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Khan be removed from the student register and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5,470.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

\* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate
