#### Disciplinary Committee ordered member excluded

On 31 October 2024, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr Bin Deng of Weifang City, China:

#### Allegations

Mr Bin Deng ('Mr Deng'), at all material times an ACCA trainee:

- Whether by himself or through a third party applied for membership to ACCA on or about 23 September 2022 and in doing so purported to confirm in relation to his ACCA Practical Experience training record he had achieved the following Performance Objectives:
  - Performance Objective 2: Stakeholder relationship management
  - Performance Objective 3: Strategy and innovation
  - Performance Objective 4: Governance, risk and control
  - Performance Objective 5: Leadership and management
  - Performance Objective 6: Record and process transactions and events
  - Performance Objective 7: Prepare external financial reports
  - Performance Objective 9: Evaluate investment and financing decisions
  - Performance Objective 13: Plan and control performance
- 2. Mr Deng's conduct in respect of the matters described in Allegation 1 above was:
  - a) Dishonest in that Mr Deng knew he had not achieved all or any of the performance objectives referred to in Allegation 1 above as described in the corresponding performance objective statements or at all.
- 4. Failed to co-operate with ACCA's Investigating Officer in breach of Complaints and Disciplinary Regulation 3(1) in that he failed to respond fully or at all to any or all of ACCA's correspondence dated,

- a) 05 April 2024
- b) 22 April 2024
- c) 07 May 2024
- 5. By reason of his conduct, Mr Deng is:
  - a) Guilty of misconduct pursuant to ACCA bye-law 8(a)(i) in respect of any or all the matters set out at 1 to 4 above.

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr Bin Deng be excluded from membership with immediate effect and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5688.00.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

\* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
