Disciplinary Committee ordered member admonished

On 04 September 2024, the Disciplinary Committee of ACCA (the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) found proved the following allegations against Mr John Edward Alexander of Nottingham, United Kingdom:

Allegations

Allegation 1

- That on 17 November 2016, John Alexander purchased a motor vehicle for his own personal use (a) which he then caused to be:
 - (i) Registered as an asset of Company A, of which he was the Finance Director.

Allegation 2

(a) That John Alexander sent a letter to ACCA dated 19 June 2019 in which he incorrectly stated that the purchase of a motor vehicle was initially processed through Company A in error.

Allegation 3

Contrary to Regulation 3(1)(a) of the Complaints and Disciplinary Regulations 2014 (as applicable in 2021), John Alexander failed to co-operate fully with the investigation of a complaint in that he failed to respond fully or at all to ACCA's correspondence on:

- (a) 18 February 2021; and/or
- 12 March 2021; and/or (b)

(c) 29 March 2021.

Allegation 4

By reason of his conduct, Mr Alexander is:

(b) Liable to disciplinary action in respect of any or all the matters set out at allegations 1(b)(iii) and/or 3, pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(iii).

The Disciplinary Committee ordered that Mr John Edward Alexander be admonished and to pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £5000.00.

Please note that this may be the subject of an appeal.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's findings and orders by way of a news release, as soon as practicable.

* An order made by the Disciplinary Committee shall take effect from the date of expiry of the Appeal Period referred to in the Appeal Regulations unless the Committee directs that the order should have immediate effect
