## Member severely reprimanded\*

On 10 March 2025 the Consent Orders Chair of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) found proved the following allegations against a member, Mr James Stephens, of Narberth, Dyfed, **United Kingdom:** 

## **Allegations**

- 1. Mr James Stephens admits the following:
  - Between November 2018 and August 2024, failed on behalf of the Firm Company A, to comply a. with the Money Laundering, Terrorist Financing and Transfer of Funds (Information on the Payer) Regulations 2017 ("MLRs") namely:
    - İ. Regulation 18 (Firm-wide risk assessment by relevant persons) and
    - ii. Regulation 19 (Policies, controls and procedures)
  - By reason of the conduct set out at Allegation 1, Mr James Stephens failed to comply with b. Section B2 of ACCA's Code of Ethics and Conduct (Anti-Money Laundering) (as applicable in 2018 to 2024).
  - By reason of the conduct in respect of the matters set out at allegations a. and b. above, Mr C. Stephens is guilty of misconduct pursuant to bye-law 8(a)(i).
- 2. That Mr Stephens shall be severely reprimanded and shall pay a fine in the sum of £5000 and shall pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £2005.

The Consent Orders Chair ordered that Mr Stephens be severely reprimanded and pay costs to ACCA in the sum of £2005. and a fine of £5000.

ACCA's regulations require ACCA to publish the Committee's finding and orders by way of a press release, as soon as practicable.
